Addressing Gender Based Violence, A 3-Part Series <u>RECAP</u>

Thank you to everyone who joined our discussions on gender-based violence, a 3-part panel series focused on our priority issue campaign of Protecting Women. We are so grateful to our collection of panelists who shared their knowledge with us. We set out to have a public conversation with our wider association on what it really means to keep women and gender-expansive people safe from violence.

In our first panel, we spoke to Rev. KC Slack (they/them) and Rev. Leela Sinha (SIN-HA) (ze/zim/zir) about their experiences as genderqueer religious professionals. In our second panel, we spoke with Rev. Daniel Lawlor (he/him) and Rev. Michael Crumpler (he/him), male religious professions who work at the local and national level. Our last panel was a conversation with Rev. Ashley Horan (she/her), Rev. Latifa Griffin (she/her), and Rev. Kimberly Quinn Johnson (she/her). (should we link to their work bio pages?)

rights. We noted in all three panels that men were not having the same conversations, or at least not publicly or noticeably in our congregations. Each of our panelists gave actionable steps we could take in our communities, like placing national hotline numbers in our bathrooms, or making a risk assessment plan for our churches.


JOIN MIGHTY NETWORKS NOW
